





Fair Memories

As we are about to celebrate the 150th Sibley County Fair, I started to think about what the fair is, the history that has taken place and the memories that are made. The fair has seen a lot through the past 150 years. Just think about how things have changed since the first fair. If the first fair was started to showcase agriculture in the area, did area residents bring their livestock, produce, baked goods, and other items to be judged? Was there new farm equipment displayed? What were those first fairs like? The grounds have sure changed a lot since then, buildings taken down, buildings added. The fair has grown. A picture of the ground in the fair office from

(I believe) the 1950's shows a much different looking fair from the one today. So much has changed in the past 150 years but the one thing that will never change is the people who come to the fair and the memories they make.

Think about why you come to the fair. Is it to enter something in the horticulture building? Are you a 4-H family with dreams of getting a trip to the state fair? Do you come to see old friends? Is it for the food? Do you just have to get a rib sandwich, a pork chop, a piece of pie, cheese curds or a malt from the malt stand? I think everyone has their favorite must have food item at the fair. Or, do you just come because you have been coming to the fair for years? Your answers are probably the same as those who came to the fair and those who still come to the fair for the past 150 years. For myself the fair has been a part of life for as long as I can remember. My grandparents met at the Freeborn County Fair and were very active exhibiting and volunteering at the fair. I remember how excited my grandmother was when I told her I was on the



Fair Board. She handed me a stack of exhibitor handbooks from their fair. That's how it is with my family. The fair is part of our lives

I have a lot of great memories of the fair and many firsts. Some say I don't have a very good memory but there are things and experiences that always stand out. My fair memories started, like many friends I know, through 4-H. I showed my first Holstein heifer at the fair. The fair was a lot different back then. showed outside. There were bunks down the center of the cattle barn where we tied the cattle to. 4-H projects were in the white block building. So many things have been in the building since then, sheep and goats, draft horses, I even remember the malt stand being in that building. One of my first projects judged in that building was a display on fish identification.

Livestock, however, was a big part of my fair memories. That first heifer grew into a cow and I remember having to milk her at the fair in the building that stood almost in front of where the new cattle barn is. We had to borrow

an old milker and strap from my grandpa. Those who showed dairy back then know what I'm talking about. I showed a few more Holstein cows at the fair before moving on to showing beef. The fair and 4-H was a part of my life back then and, oh, the memories that were made. Sleeping in those bunks at the fair, getting accidently sprayed in the wash rack while washing my animals. I don't know how much money I spent trying to win a pop by throwing a ball at a stack of bottles in an effort to knock them all down. I think it was the Seratoma who had that. I even, if you can believe it, was part of an Arts In performance at the fair where I sang and danced.

Even after I graduated and was done with 4-H, the fair was a big part of my life that I always came back to. I entered various items in the horticulture building, got a blue ribbon on my brownies a few times. My first taste of racing came at the fair when I entered the demolition derby and then the Enduro Race. Even when I was racing the fair seem to be the one race that stood out as the one race I really wanted to do well at. Not sure why because it was just

another race, but it was the fair. No matter where I went it seemed I always came back for the fair.

Now I am making memories with my kids. Watching them ride the rides, eating cobs of sweet corn, and playing with the goats when they were young. They are in 4-H now, showing animals, exhibiting their projects, making their own memories. So, some things change but, like staying up late to finish those fair projects, some thing may never change. Good or bad, happy or sad the fair has given me a lot of memories.

So, what is the fair really? Is it the fairground itself, the exhibitors, the vendors, the rides, the animals or the buildings? I think the fair is so much more than that. The fair is an experience, it's the memories you take with you. The fair will always change. It's different now than it was when I was young and I'm sure it will be different when my kids grow up. It has changed a lot since that first Fair 150 years ago, but the idea of the Fair will always be the same. It is a place where we gather to show off our hard work, compete, have fun, say hi to old friends and meet new ones.

Stop and think, what are some of your fair memories? What makes the fair so special? The county fair has stood the test of time. There is one in almost every county in the state. Each one is unique and has their own special thing, but the one thing that makes every County fair the same is the memories and experience those who go to the fair will receive. The fair brings people together in a way no other event in the area does. So, come out to the 150th annual Sibley County Fair and make some memories of your own.

The 911 Never Forget Mobile Exhibit is a tribute to all those who lost their lives on September 1, 2001, including, of course, the 343 members of the FDNY who made the ultimate sacrifice.

The high-tech, 53-foot tractor-trailer, which transforms into a 1,000 square foot exhibit, is a tool to further educate citizens throughout the country about the events of that tragic day.

The Memorial provides interactive education; including artifacts such as steel beams from the towers, documentary videos, and recordings of first responder radio transmission.
